NEW MINISTRY OPPORTUNITY...

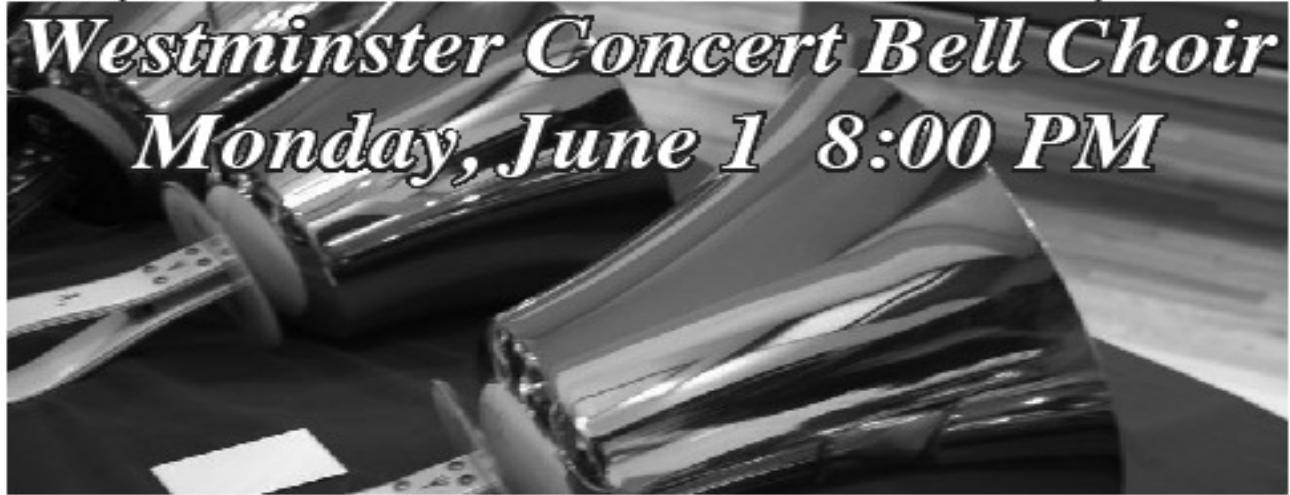

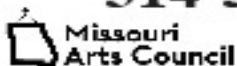

HELPING THE CATHEDRAL SHINE...

Over the years, it has been not only monetary gifts left to the Cathedral Basilica that have largely enabled us to continue to operate as a place of worship and as a place to protect and teach our children, but also the selfless acts of stewardship performed by our devoted parishioners and school families that help our parish and school illuminate with from the inside out. Recently, several parishioners and a group of our Cathedral School students came together one morning to clean areas of the Cathedral Basilica that oftentimes go unattended. The rectory staff would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to these wonderful men, women, and children. We further invite any of our parishioners to join us again for another morning of cleaning this **Thursday, April 16**. We will meet at the center aisle of the church immediately following the 8:00 a.m. daily Mass, and work till just before the 12:05 p.m. daily Mass.

WHY A REGISTERED PARISHIONER...

Due to the number of requests for baptisms, the Cathedral Parish adopted a policy some years ago that generally requires the parents to be registered parishioners in the Cathedral parish before their infant may be baptized here. For the same reason, normal policy practice requires the bride or groom in an impending wedding to be a registered parishioner and practicing Catholic for a minimum of one year for preferred dates and for a more modest stipend. Non-parishioners must be registered in a Catholic parish somewhere and will need to secure their pastor's permission to be baptized or married outside of their proper parish before we can schedule any ceremony for them. If you attend Mass at the Cathedral Basilica regularly, please consider becoming a registered parishioner. Forms may be obtained by calling the rectory office at 314-373-8200.

MAKE MORE FREQUENT USE...

Every Catholic should recognize that the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation is a gift from the Lord to be used frequently and effectively - not just a seasonal sacrament but an all-year opportunity to meet Christ as Christ intended Himself to be welcomed: as the merciful Redeemer.
