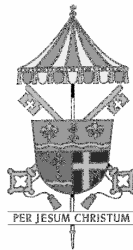

WELCOME ARCHBISHOP-ELECT CARLSON...

This week, we are truly blessed with the arrival and installation of the Most Rev. Robert J. Carlson, Archbishop-elect and tenth bishop of Saint Louis! And in anticipation of this joyous event and in response to the numerous questions coming into the Cathedral Basilica rectory, we present the following information originally printed in this weekend's edition of the St. Louis Review, reprinted with permission.

ARCHBISHOP'S INSTALLATION: KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

What events are open to the public? The evening prayer service, to be held at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, June 9, and the installation, 2 p.m. Wednesday, June 10, are open to the public. The procession before the installation Mass will begin at 1:30 p.m. Both events will be held at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis, Lindell Boulevard and Newstead Avenue in the Central West End. In addition, a reception will follow both events at Rosati-Kain High School, located next door. The receptions also are open to the public. There is no cost to attend.

What is Evening Prayer? As a tradition, the evening prayer service is generally held the night before an archbishop's installation. During the service, religious and civic leaders, as well as representatives of the various groups that make up the Archdiocese of St. Louis will be presented to Archbishop-elect Carlson.

Where can I park? There will be 45 degree angle parking on Lindell Boulevard, in front of the Cathedral Basilica, and on Maryland Avenue, from Taylor to Newstead Avenue. Some other side street parking will be available. Handicapped parking will be available in the cathedral basilica's lot at Maryland and Newstead.

What streets will be blocked off? Waiting on information.

How long will the events last? The evening prayer service is expected to last about 90 minutes. Archbishop-elect Carlson will deliver a homily that evening. The installation will last about three-and-a-half hours, including the procession at the beginning of the Mass.

What should I wear? The installation is a formal event, and individuals should dress in an appropriate and modest fashion.

If I can't go, where can I go to watch/listen to the events? Several TV stations will carry coverage of the installation. The Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN) will air the installation at 2 p.m. June 10, with repeat coverage at 11 p.m. Thursday, June 11. EWTN is on channel 370 for Direct TV subscribers. Cable market stations will vary. Catholic TV will air coverage of the installation at 2 p.m. and again at 7 p.m. June 10. The station is on Sky Angel channel 142 (on demand). Local Catholic radio stations WRYT (1080AM) and KHOJ (1460AM) also will have live coverage of the Installation.

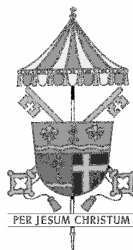
What kind of online coverage will there be? The Archdiocese of St. Louis will have a live video stream of both the evening prayer service and installation at its website, archstl.org. Photos and stories also will be posted at the Review's website, stlouisreview.com, throughout the week.

Will I actually get to meet Archbishop-elect Carlson at the reception? Every person who attends either of the receptions at Rosati-Kain will have the opportunity to briefly greet the archbishop at the entrance to the school.

How do I address the Archbishop? "Archbishop Carlson" is an appropriate way to address him. Those who prefer a more formal approach may say "Your Grace" or "Your Excellency." Any of those options, however, are equally appropriate.

Should I kiss his ring? The pious custom of kissing an archbishop's ring is an acceptable practice. However, a simple handshake is an equally acceptable way of greeting him.

Can I take a picture with the archbishop? There will be an opportunity for a quick photo at the reception.

WHY A REGISTERED PARISHIONER...

Due to the number of requests for baptisms, the Cathedral Parish adopted a policy some years ago that generally requires the parents to be registered parishioners in the Cathedral parish before their infant may be baptized here. For the same reason, normal policy practice requires the bride or groom in an impending wedding to be a registered parishioner and practicing Catholic for a minimum of one year for preferred dates and for a more modest stipend. Non-parishioners must be registered in a Catholic parish somewhere and will need to secure their pastor's permission to be baptized or married outside of their proper parish before we can schedule any ceremony for them. If you attend Mass at the Cathedral Basilica regularly, please consider becoming a registered parishioner. Forms may be obtained by calling the rectory office at 314-373-8200.

WEEKLY THOUGHTS ON GIVING...

"The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ..."

INFANT BAPTISM...

According to the mind of the Church, parents are obliged to see that infants are baptized within the first weeks after birth. As soon as possible after the birth, or even before it, parents should request the sacrament for their child and are to be properly instructed in preparation for it. And in order for the baptism to be scheduled, there must be a well-founded hope that the infant will be raised in the practice of the Catholic faith. Parents are encouraged to attend baptismal preparation before their child is born; then, immediately after the child is born, the date of baptism can be scheduled by calling the rectory at 314-373-8200.

REMEMBER THE CATHEDRAL BASILICA...

LITURGICAL ETIQUETTE . . .

External gestures of reverence can become a witness to the truths of our faith. For this reason, we wish to remind our guests and parishioners from time to time of habits or practices which are not appropriate.

- The rule of fasting from solid food for an hour before one receives the Eucharist still holds, and thus makes the **chewing of gum** in church completely disrespectful and inappropriate.

- Although the Church does not require everyone to be dressed in their “Easter finest” every week for Mass, please remember that the way we dress for church is, oftentimes, a sign of how important the celebration of the Eucharist is to us. **Overly revealing clothing or bare midriffs are never appropriate.**

- Churches are meant to be sacred space, places where all can pray and worship. While a cordial greeting is never out of place, carrying on an **audible and protracted conversation is never appropriate.**

- External gestures of reverence can become a witness to the truths of our faith. The bow immediately before receiving Holy Communion should be done with the conscious recognition that it is the Lord Himself before Whom we bow. He is truly present in the Eucharist, in both the host and the cup, and in either of them. The extension of the hands must acknowledge our acceptance of a gift, not a grabbing for something owed us. The hands are completely empty, extended in the gesture of acceptance. **The Lord should not be just another item among keys or other personal items.**

- Our spoken and sung responses at Mass are always meant to be done communally, with whatever abilities were bestowed on us by our Father. What is believed and held in our hearts ought to be expressed outwardly during the Mass **in word and in music.**

- Finally, out of respect and reverence for the presence of Christ in the Eucharist, **arriving at Mass on time and remaining until the priest has recessed down the aisle is appropriate behavior.** Leaving Mass early and disturbing the flow of communion in order to exit is never appropriate. Please place cell phones and beepers in the silent mode, and please remain in church till the end of Mass to be blessed and commissioned to go forth in Christ’s name.
