SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM...

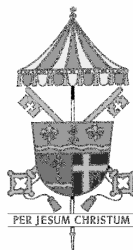

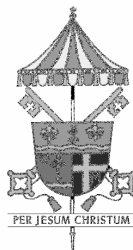
