### INFANT BAPTISM...

According to the mind of the Church, parents are obliged to see that infants are baptized within the first weeks after birth. As soon as possible after the birth, or even before it, parents should request the sacrament for their child and are to be properly instructed in preparation for it. And in order for the baptism to be scheduled, there must be a well-founded hope that the infant will be raised in the practice of the Catholic faith. Parents are encouraged to attend baptismal preparation before their child is born; then, immediately after the child is born, the date of baptism can be scheduled by calling the rectory at 314-373-8200.

### WHY A REGISTERED PARISHIONER...

Due to the number of requests for baptisms, the Cathedral Parish adopted a policy some years ago that generally requires the parents to be registered parishioners in the Cathedral parish before their infant may be baptized here. For the same reason, normal policy practice requires the bride or groom in an impending wedding to be a registered parishioner and practicing Catholic for a minimum of one year for preferred dates and for a more modest stipend. Non-parishioners must be registered in a Catholic parish somewhere and will need to secure their pastor's permission to be baptized or married outside of their proper parish before we can schedule any ceremony for them. If you attend Mass at the Cathedral Basilica regularly, please consider becoming a registered parishioner. Forms may be obtained by calling the rectory office at 314-373-8200.

### MAKE MORE FREQUENT USE...

Often, Catholics associate certain seasons with the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. However, every Catholic should recognize that the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation is a gift from the Lord to be used frequently and effectively, **not just a seasonal sacrament**, but an all-year opportunity to meet Christ as He intended: as the merciful Redeemer.

To that end, the confession schedule, which had been augmented to include daily confession at 7:30 a.m. Monday through Friday during the season of Lent, will continue indefinitely. **This daily confession time is now part of our regular confession schedule**, as detailed on the cover of this bulletin.

### NEW PARKING AVAILABLE...

After more than a year of construction activities, the new archdiocesan parking lot at the corner of Lindell and Taylor is paved, striped, and ready for use! Though the permanent signage has not yet been installed, and workers continue landscaping activities, the lot is available for use by our parishioners and visitors not only for special events, but for use during daily and Sunday Mass attendance as well. And please remember: just as when parking on the surrounding streets or on the Cathedral's north lot, necessary caution is directed to everyone to carefully avoid leaving purses, packages, computers, and other valuables on the car seats in full view. Lock them in the trunk out of sight. The police and cathedral staff will continue to regularly patrol the grounds and parking areas, however everyone should exercise prudent responsibility.

### HEARING HIS CALL...

Every baptized person has a call directly from the Lord to His service. Our discipleship is a vocation to holiness and service of the Lord. Some of the baptized receive another call within that call to the specific vocation of ordained priesthood or vowed religious life. Their response to that vocational invitation requires generosity and a life long commitment. More than in the immediate past, many young people are stepping forward to respond positively to the invitation; many more are needed. For all of them, the support of family, friends, and fellow Catholics ought to be expected, though it is not always present. Each Catholic must make prayer in support of young people's vocational response an integral and necessary component of their daily regimen of prayer; it is not an “extra”, but rather a major part of everyone's discipleship.

### ALERT FOR NATIONAL HOLIDAY...

Next Sunday, July 4, our nation celebrates its birthday and marks the anniversary of the **Declaration of Independence**. We celebrate the political and social heritage which we have received from our founding fathers. At the heart of their expression of political independence from the colonial overlords from Europe was the acknowledgement that "unalienable rights to life and liberty" are the endowment we receive from our Creator, and not from any worldly power. We Catholics express our continued gratefulness to the Creator, whom we know as our heavenly Father, through the supreme expression of thanksgiving which is the Eucharist. Certainly then, Holy Mass on the holiday is the best "celebration" of our independence from this world's power and our dependence on God. Join us next Sunday for the Mass according to the usual Sunday Mass schedule: **8:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m., noon, and 5:00 p.m.**

### EUCHARISTIC EXPOSITION...

The Blessed Sacrament, the very presence of Christ’s body and blood in the Eucharist, is reserved in the tabernacle of the Blessed Sacrament Chapel to the east of the main sanctuary. At all hours the Cathedral is open, people may be found praying there before the Lord "face to face." Each Saturday afternoon, beginning at 3:30 p.m., the Eucharist is displayed for prayer and adoration in public exposition in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel for a holy hour. Following this holy hour, the Evening Prayer of the Church with Benediction is celebrated. Please join in this Eucharistic Prayer before or after Confession.

### ASSISTANCE FOR PARISHIONERS...

### LITURGICAL ETIQUETTE . . .

External gestures of reverence can become a witness to the truths of our faith. For this reason, we wish to remind our guests and parishioners from time to time of habits or practices which are not appropriate.

- The rule of fasting from solid food for an hour before one receives the Eucharist still holds, and thus makes the **chewing of gum** in church completely disrespectful and inappropriate.

- Although the Church does not require everyone to be dressed in their "Easter finest" every week for Mass, please remember that the way we dress for church is, oftentimes, a sign of how important the celebration of the Eucharist is to us. **Overly revealing clothing or bare midriffs are never appropriate.**

- Churches are meant to be sacred space, places where all can pray and worship. While a cordial greeting is never out of place, carrying on an **audible and protracted conversation is never appropriate.**

- External gestures of reverence can become a witness to the truths of our faith. The bow immediately before receiving Holy Communion should be done with the conscious recognition that it is the Lord Himself before Whom we bow. He is truly present in the Eucharist, in both the host and the cup, and in either of them. The extension of the hands must acknowledge our acceptance of a gift, not a grabbing for something owed us. The hands are completely empty, extended in the gesture of acceptance. **The Lord should not be just another item among keys or other personal items.**

- Our spoken and sung responses at Mass are always meant to be done communally, with whatever abilities were bestowed on us by our Father. What is believed and held in our hearts ought to be expressed outwardly during the Mass **in word and in music.**

- Finally, out of respect and reverence for the presence of Christ in the Eucharist, **arriving at Mass on time and remaining until the priest has recessed down the aisle is appropriate behavior.** Leaving Mass early and disturbing the flow of communion in order to exit is never appropriate. Please place cell phones and beepers in the silent mode, and please remain in church till the end of Mass to be blessed and commissioned to go forth in Christ's name.
